Outbound Travel to Europe / UK / island of Ireland

- The middle to high income population take two holidays per year from 5 to 15 days.
- The busiest outbound period is over the summer months from mid June to mid September. Asia and Europe are the key destinations.
- UAE Nationals often travel in large family groups (6-16 pax).
- Western expatriates travel to their home country to see family then go on a 7-10 day family holiday. The most popular destinations for this holiday are Italy and France or the UAE and onto Asia.
- Travel Business in the Gulf Countries both inbound and outbound was worth €148 billion in 2006. 38% is for outbound travel.

Planning a Sales Trip to the UAE

- Prepare well in advance of the trip

- The Middle East is multi-cultured and you will be meeting people of diverse nationalities. Try and ascertain who you are meeting in advance, whether local Indian, British etc.

Technology

- The internet is important for viewing information but not for booking, as people in the region are reluctant to give credit card details on line.
- Most online research is focused on hotels and destinations

Visa Requirement

- Cost of Visa to Ireland:
 €65 (AED295)- Single Entry, €106 (AED490)
 - Multiple Entry. The visa office is located in Dubai.
- Cost of Visa to UK & Northern Ireland:
 105 Euro (AED 475) - Single and Multiple Entry.
 The UK has a Consulate in Dubai and Embassy in Abu Dhabi.
- Both Visa's can be issued within 24 hours
